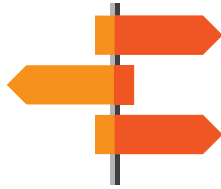

## GETTING KIDS out of the SCHOOL-TO-PRISON PIPELINE

In 2015, we worked with the Minnesota Department of Corrections to do a comprehensive ten year look-back on our juvenile justice program.

*We found that 83% of our youth in the program stayed out of the prison system.*

## HOW GOOD IS THAT?

A 2010 study of juvenile justice programs in Indiana found that 26.5% of the juvenile justice were in an adult prison within three years.<sup>1</sup>

A 2012 study found that 70% of Illinois juvenile justice residential clients were in an adult prison within five years.<sup>2</sup>
