NATIONAL TRENDS IN JUVENILE JUSTICE

From the National Center for Juvenile Justice, December 2014

Two-thirds of youth referred for an offense during 2014 had experienced a form of child welfare involvement.

Nine in ten youth who had been previously referred had history of child welfare involvement

61% of youth surveyed had been either victims of or witnesses to violence in the past year.

63% of violent crimes committed by juveniles occured on school days.

70% of youth in placement said they had "something very bad or terrifying happen" to them and **67%** said that they had "seen someone injured or killed (in person)."

93% of juvenile offenders reported at least one traumatic experience. The average number of *different* traumas reported was *six*.

For decades, Woodland Hills Juvenile Justice program has been a leader known to help youth redirect their path to a successful future.

TRAUMA INFORMED CARE

Woodland Hills provides a therapeutic, structured, non-secure residential juvenile justice program. A combination of positive peer interactions, trust, safety, and clear expectations allow youth to work through their behavioral and mental health issues.

The core of our treatment is the belief that youth have the potential for responsible behavior. Our goal is to empower youth to partner in their own healing, while showing care and respect to others.

All staff are trained in trauma informed care and our therapists are trained in Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy. We understand the prevalence and impact of trauma on youth and the complex paths toward healing and recovery.

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT For adjudicated and social service placed youth

For Males and Females ages 12 - 18 (up through 21 if designated Extended Juvenile Jurisdiction).

- Chisholm 30/Short Term Residential is our 30 days or less program.

 The program stresses accountability for behavior and emotional management in order to reduce the need for further out-of-home placement. This gender responsive program challenges youth and teaches responsibility through its cognitive behavioral approach.
- Long-term Residential Treatment (includes 90/120)

The program addresses behavioral, emotional, chemical and mental health needs. Includes gender responsive programming, an individualized treatment plan that addresses criminogenic risk factors, utilizes evidence based practices, and empowers youth to invest in the process of change. Flexible lengths of stays are available based on youth's needs.

· Community Transition

The program offers a healthy living environment for young men to transition back into the community. The program teaches youth the skills needed to live independently and offers services that address education, employment and life skills.
