

Author, therapist shares her childhood trauma survival story



Catherine McCall, the author of the 2009 memoir “Never Tell: The True Story of Overcoming a Terrifying Childhood,” discussed her experience with trauma, repressed memories and healing during a Hills Youth and Family Service presentation at the Holiday Inn in Duluth May 8. More than 200 people attended the 60-minute talk.

Children carry scars inflicted by negligent and abusive parents for a long time, but those scars can be healed with strong and loving adult relationships, professional help and the courage to face the past, said a best selling author, retired therapist and childhood trauma survivor.
